Lent and Forgiveness!!

Learning from the Judeo-Christian perspective, forgiving is more than letting go, it is about removing those barriers that hold one peace, "wipe away" and be "gracious to" your offender, meaning you have power to make him or her suffer but chose to sure mercy because "God's mercy is shown in forgiveness of sins." Even though, a victim can choose not to forgive his or her offender but when the decision is made it becomes an act of mercy, "an attribute of both God and a good human being." In my own understanding from the Judeo-Christian perspective mercy is prompted by the victim when an offender expresses or come to repentance and forgiveness open the door to reconciliation which is encourage from a religious viewpoint because seeking forgiveness from God or a higher power is to mend relationship once broken. As we reflect on the narrative of Jacob and Esau, we will learn the process to true repentance/apology and reconciliation.

The Story of Esau and Jacob

The narrative of Esau and Jacob as noted through the texts of the Bible, Genesis 25:19-33:1-17 tells a family story of deceit, hatred, hurt, repentance, forgiveness, and conciliation, it is a story that can help and teach both religious and non-religious folks the concept of forgiveness. This story also helps and teaches us to look or study the mind or thoughts of an offender seeking forgiveness from the victim. According to the narrative Esau and Jacob were twins born to Isaac and Rebekah as a result of divine intervention. *When the boys grew up, Esau was a skillful hunter, a man of the field, while Jacob was a quiet man, living in tent. Isaac loved Esau because he was fond of game; but Rebekah.* (Genesis 25:27-28)

Thus, parents' choice of love among their children usually brings about sibling rivalry as noted in the story of Esau and Jacob. In this biblical narrative Esau is the victim and Jacob alone with his mother is the offenders; even though much is not focus on their mother who put in motion the plan to hurt her elder son Esau. As their father got older and blind, he asked his elder son to prepare him a food while his wife listens. Isaac to Esau *prepare for me savory food, as such as I like, and bring it to me to eat, so that I may bless you before I die* (Genesis 27:4). In verses 5 to 29 of Genesis 27 Rebekah, the mother of both Esau and Jacob put into motion her plan of betrayal toward her elder son and the younger son followed through with it and was given the blessings meant for Esau the elder son. The question of reflection is what is one reaction when a wrong has been done to you? Especially, when it is cause by someone close to you, like you brother or sister as in the story of Esau and Jacob?

The scriptural text described Esau reaction to the betrayal like this: *Now Esau hated Jacob because of the blessing with which his father had blessed him, and Esau said to himself, "the days of morning for my father are approaching; then I will kill my brother Jacob."* (Genesis 27:41) This can be a normal reaction when a wrong happened to you, especially by someone awfully close to you. Thus, it is good to be angry, frustrated, and want the offender to hurt just the way you do but then the question remains will revenge bring you happiness or remove the hurt you are experiencing? Since revenge cannot bring the sense of peace the Judeo-Christian teaching encourages the victims to seek the offender express his or her hurt because at times offenders does not know at times, they have caused a wrong (Matthew 18:15),

In the narrative, Jacob, the offended not just repented but put in place reparation for his brother because of the hurt caused. In Genesis 32:3-13 Jacob expresses his remorse through his mediator, his messenger whom he sent with reparation for his brother. At their meeting Esau seeing how his brother was remorseful *bowing himself to the ground seven times, until he came near his brother. But Esau ran to meet him and embraced him and fell on his neck and kiss him and wept.* (Genesis 33:3-4). Thus, Esau decision to forgive his brother is cause by the trigger of mercy or passion that is with in every living soul. In an article, *Healing in forgiveness: A discussion with Amanda Lindhout and Katherine Porterfield*, Amanda notes that in her abduction and being abuse both mentally and sexual her sense to forgive was innate of compassion was triggered. In her own words: "When I realized that he was driven to create suffering for me because of his own state of suffering most unexpectedly, I felt compassion. The more I gravitated to compassion, the stronger my conviction to forgive became a gift to my own self." Therefore, the ability to forgive is inherent in every living soul but it takes some victim years and other victim.

Finally, in a little book title: *I'M Sorry: The Art of Apology & The Gift of Forgiveness*, forgiveness is defined as follow: "Forgiving does not necessarily mean forgetting. Instead, forgiving means we decide to deliberately let go of our negative feelings caused by the other person when they made a mistake. When we have been hurt, negative feelings like betrayal, anger, and resentment can come to the surface. Overtime, if these feelings are not addressed, they can overwhelm us on both an emotional and physical level. Granting forgiveness is truly a gift, not just to the person who has done wrong, but also to ourselves. Forgiveness allows us to let go of the past and move." Lastly, remember the prayer Jesus taught us, "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those you sin against us." Blessed Lent!!
